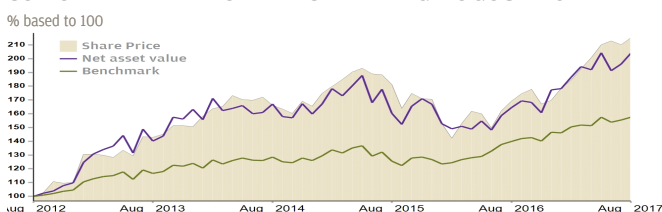
Ordinary Shares

Management Commentary

The company's net asset value outperformed the benchmark in July, while the share price underperformed. Key positive contributors included our positions in Novae Group, Rio Tinto and Persimmon. Novae Group is a Lloyd's insurance underwriter, which received a takeover offer at a 20% premium over its pre-bid price. Rio Tinto, an international mining company, benefited from a rise in the price of iron ore. Persimmon, which is one of the largest UK housebuilders, rose as trading continues to be strong, confounding fears of a slowdown.

Conversely, our holdings in Imperial Brands, GlaxoSmithKline and AstraZeneca detracted from returns. Imperial Brands, formerly known as Imperial Tobacco, fell as the United States of America Food and Drug Administration announced plans to pursue cutting nicotine in cigarettes to non-addictive levels. Meanwhile, pharmaceutical giant AstraZeneca was hit by unfavourable trial results for its next generation cancer drugs. In the same sector, GlaxoSmithKline performed poorly over what we consider misplaced concerns about future dividend payments.

COMPANY STRUCTURE

JPMorgan Income & Capital Trust plc (the Company) is a split-capital investment trust that invests in a broadly diversified portfolio investing principally in UK Equities and investment grade fixed interest securities. The Company may utilise gearing when appropriate to increase potential returns to shareholders. The Company has a fixed life which expires at the end of February 2018 unless, prior to that date, shareholders and unitholders approve alternative arrangements. The Ordinary Shares represent one class of shares issued by the Company and aim to provide regular quarterly income, together with the potential for capital growth. Ordinary Shareholders are entitled to all dividends paid by the Company and, on winding up, to all of the Company's surplus assets (including any growth in their value) after satisfying all liabilities of the Company and the accrued capital entitlement of the holders of the Zero Dividend Preference (ZDP) shares. The final capital entitlement per ZDP share due at the end of February 2018 is 192.13p (£89,557,000 based on the current ZDP shares in issue). It should be noted that Ordinary Shares rank behind any bank borrowings, other creditors and the ZDP shares and if the total assets of the Company do not exceed the prior ranking entitlements of the ZDP Shareholders, the Ordinary Shareholders will receive nothing upon the wind-up date. Ordinary shareholders should note that the Ordinary shares are considered to carry above-average risk. Please refer to the key facts below.

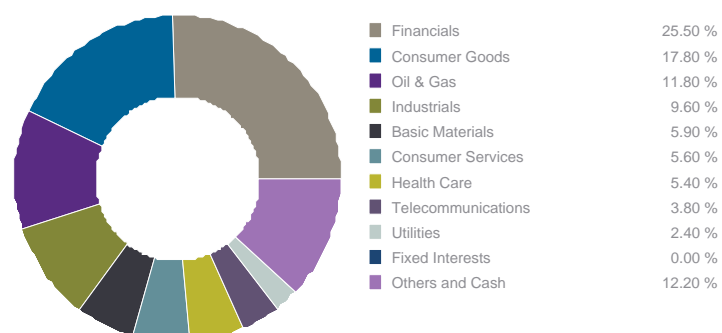

GLOSSARY OF TERMS

BENCHMARK COMPARISON - Comparison of the Company's performance is made with the benchmark. The benchmark is a recognised index of stocks which should not be taken as wholly representative of the Company's investment universe. The Company's investment strategy does not follow or track this index and therefore there may be a degree of divergence between its performance and that of the Company.

CASH - Net current assets including investment in liquidity funds & treasury stocks (if held) and drawn revolving credit facilities (if any) with an original maturity of less than 1 year.

DISCOUNT / PREMIUM - If the share price of an investment company is lower than the net asset value (NAV) per share, the company is said to be trading at a discount. If the share price of an investment company is higher than the net asset value (NAV) per share, the company is said to be trading at a premium. The discount/premium is shown as a percentage of the NAV.
